RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE OF YOUR ADIRONDACK ADVENTURE

Only 1 mile west of Whiteface Mountain Ski Center and 8 miles east of Lake Placid on Route 86, Wilmington, NY.

DIRECTIONS TO 4761 ROUTE 86, WILMINGTON, NY 12997

From I-87 (The Northway) Going South

Take Exit 34 (Ausable Forks). Turn left onto Route 9N heading southbound. In the town of Jay, turn right onto Route 86 West. High Falls Gorge is just 1 mile past Whiteface Mountain Ski Center on the right side of the road.

From I-87 (The Northway) Going North

Take Exit 30 (Keene/Keene Valley). Turn left following Route 73 west toward Lake Placid. Turn right on River Road just before the ski jumps entrance. Turn right onto Route 86 east. High Falls Gorge is 5 miles ahead on the left.

- Lake George, NY: 78 Miles | 1.5 Hours
- Albany, NY: 140 Miles | 2.5 Hours
- Montreal, Canada: 150 Miles | 2.5 Hours

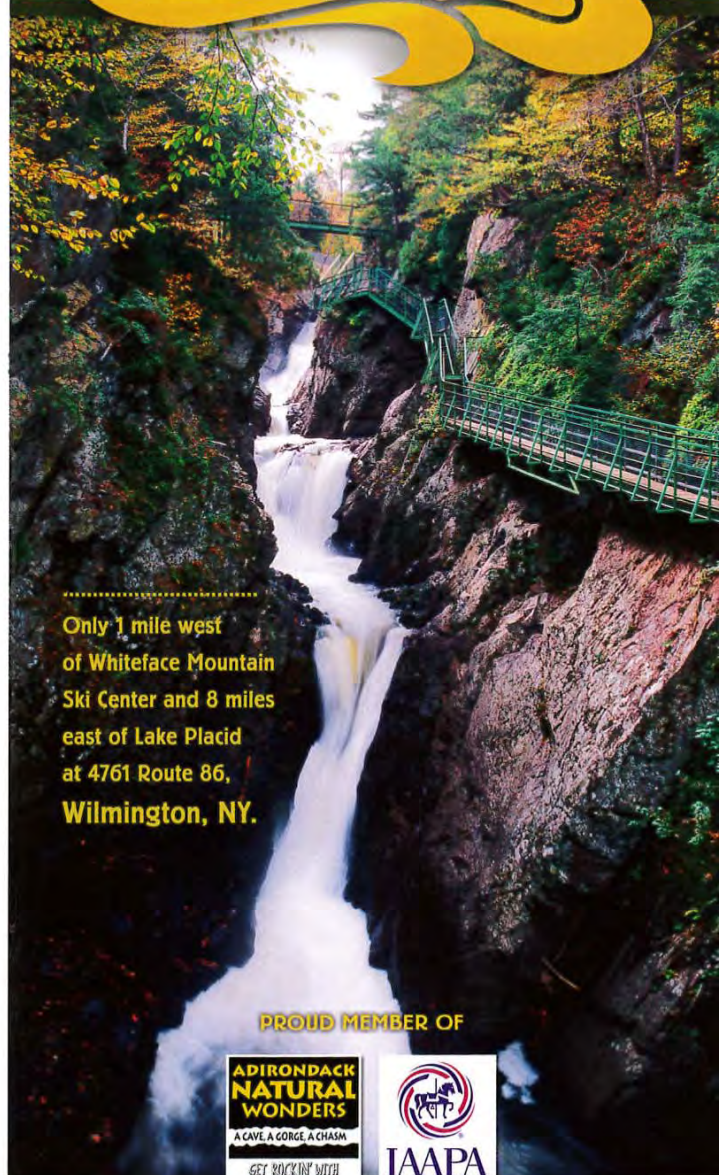

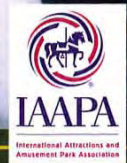
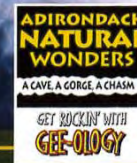
